Project Lifesaver's mission is to use state of the art technology in assisting those who care for victims of Alzheimer's and other Related Mental Dysfunction Disorders (ARMD) and victims who become lost. These victims include the elderly and even the youngest in

our community who are afflicted with Down syndrome and Autism. There are no boundaries — no one is immune!

Victims of ARMD tend to wander from their homes. Project Lifesaver International places

personalized radio transmitters on identified persons with ARMD. These transmitters assist caregivers and local emergency agencies in locating those who cannot help themselves.

- **X** A large number of transmitters have been placed on those with Alzheimer's, Dementia and children with Autism or Down syndrome.
- X Local emergency teams responded to calls resulting in an average rescue time of less than 30-minutes.

Project Lifesaver International is volunteer staffed 24 hours a day, seven days


