What is Law Enforcement Collaboration?

Approaching crimes in a comprehensive manner, focusing on successful prosecution and incorporating the prevention of future crimes. This approach is performed by tearning up traditional police investigations with prosecution, advocates, counselors, and local agencies.

What is a Social Worker?

Police Department Employee who possesses a Master's Degree in social work, psychology, or counseling. Their primary function is to implement law enforcement approaches and coordinate clinical programming for the Police Department. Social Workers also provide family counseling, post-trauma counseling at crime scenes, and functional supervision of Family Support Workers and interns.


What is a Family Support Worker?

Police Department Employees who assists with family management skill-building techniques and accesses resources for basic needs. Family Support Workers provide in-home case management functions, parenting training, court support, and are a resource linking isolated citizens, victims, and families to their community.

Who Provides the Counseling?

Counseling services are provided by college interns earning either a Bachelor or Master's Degree in a counseling-based program in the university system. The Vacaville Police Department has a contractual agreement to provide intern supervision. Counseling services include crisis intervention, safety assessment, resource linkage, and general counseling. Counseling is free of charge.
